What is WYCHAP?

The Wyoming Children's Hearing Aid Program (WYCHAP) is a fund that was established in 2012 by the Wyoming Legislature. The goal of WYCHAP is to provide timely access to hearing aids for children, ages birth through the end of their high school career, identified with hearing loss, who are either not insured or under-insured.

What if my child already has hearing aids but they are old hearing aids?

WYCHAP funds can be used for replacement hearing aids.

Is there an income requirement associated with WYCHAP?

No; parents/guardians need only to verify that hearing aids are not covered (or partially covered) by their insurance company, Medicaid (Kid Care/CHIP), Children with Special Healthcare Needs, Department of Vocational Rehab (DVR) or other available sources.

How is the WYCHAP application initiated?

Because parents/guardians are the best advocates for their children, WYCHAP is placing the primary responsibility on parents/guardians to submit all required materials.
