

## 164,863 children in Wyoming 15,100 in Special Education Only 809 on the DD waiver!



Children with Special Needs in Wyoming

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

A child must have a diagnosis of mental retardation or a developmental disability due to a related condition with significant functional limitations in 3 or more major life activities.

#### 160 KIDS ARE ON THE WAIT LIST AS OF JUNE 30, 2010

They are funded based upon severity and time spent waiting, alternately

#### INDIVIDUALIZED BUDGETED AMOUNT

Initial funding is based upon the child's ICAP adaptive behavior quotient and age.

Current IBA is based upon historical units X current rates — one time costs. No longer have a flat budget to spend.

**IBA** calculation

#### SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

Added self-direction to the waivers

Added new services

Revised service definitions

#### NO WAIVER SERVICES DURING SCHOOL HOURS

In accordance with 42 CFR §433 subpart D, FFP may not be claimed for services when another third-party (e.g., Other third party health insurer or other federal or state program) is legally liable and responsible for the provision and payment of the service. This requirement applies to all Medicaid services, including waiver services. The Medicaid program functions as the payer of last resort.

§1903(c) of the Act provides an exception to the principle that Medicaid is the payor of last resort in the case of Medicaid-reimbursable services that are included in a child's individual education plan (IEP) under the provisions of the Individuals With Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004 (IDEA). However, this exception only applies to those services that also are reimbursable under the Medicaid State Plan (including expanded EPSDT services). This exception does not apply to waiver services.

# WAIVER CAN NOT PROVIDE THERAPY TO KIDS DUE TO THE SAME REGULATION

The Division also looks closely at specialized equipment requests. Items for use at school or educational items that should be purchased by the school district will be denied.

#### SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

- \* Added service for 18-20
- \* Require documentation from school why this is not addressed in the IEP or through Vocational Rehabilitation

#### CHILD HABILITATION SERVICE

Provides an option for child care assistance for children ages 0-17

The Division is telling parents and providers that waiver services cannot be covered during the local school district hours, so they need to work with the school through the IEP process to discuss supports that meet the child's needs.


#### CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WAIVER

Provides individualized services and support based on unique strengths and needs of children and youth with serious emotional disturbances and their families

#### STATE RESPITE PROGRAM

More liberal eligibility criteria

Family receives 35 hours a month of respite

Cannot be used if child is on any other waiver


