- Supplies for families in need or with multiple kids at home





- Establish solid avenues for connecting with, supporting, celebrating, and learning from families who speak different languages

# KATE KOOL - KINDER TEACHER TRANSITION IDEAS



Start with teacher led ideas, then they can become district initiatives.

- The K team meeting with Pre-K teachers to discuss their routines/ strategies/ favorite songs and books. We did this informally at a park on a Saturday.
- 2. During the summer, reading a book aloud to incoming Kinders in the Pre-K spaces, and do a quick promo for how much fun we have in Kindergarten.
- 3. Late evening Zoom sessions with new parents in September, invite former parents.
- 4. ZOOMING during events (ABC Dance, Letter Fashion Show)

# GEERS GRANT - AN OUTDOOR LEARNING SPACE TENT, PERSONAL DESKS, MICROPHONES, FTC.

#### Uses

- --meeting as a morning meeting / closing circle (we use scoop rocker chairs and a microphone)
- There was no space in the classroom for "circle meetings"
- --Daily math / science/ art activities
- --A meeting space for teachers

#### Future Possibilities

- --Inviting parents for outdoor events (Ice cream socials, publishing parties, holiday parties, Kinder graduation)
- --teachers hosting storytimes for Pre-K students to join with their Kinder classes throughout the year.

## SEL AT THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR

STEM bins - Students choose box of blocks, legos, etc. and build! Good way for them to start the day with play, expression, and connection to me as they explain their creations.

### -Morning meetings

- 1. Make it a great day \_\_\_\_\_, respond back and pass to the next friend in the circle
- 2. Share out!
  - a. Monday "The best part of my weekend was\_\_\_\_\_"
  - b. Tuesday Newsday
  - c. Wednesday Would you rather Wednesday? Would you rather go to the pool or camping?
  - d. Thursday Favorite things "What is your favorite ice cream?"
  - e. Friday Virtual Scavenger Hunt

Use photos for everything! Ask parents for family photos, pet photos, etc. Take a lot of pictures throughout the day, review what you see, what is going well.

Super Student Lessons - boost each other up!

Be around at lunch, go to recess! Ask questions!

End the day with a closing circle, we do Roses and Thorns from the day















# <u>ALEX GOE - TCSD PRESCHOOL LIAISON</u>



- ★ Connect with area ECCs to plan collaborative opportunities and gain feedback around previous transition process.
  - Support incoming families earlier by attending information sessions, registration help nights, and preschool family nights.

★ Create an ideal transition timeline that encompasses the entire year preceding kindergarten.

- ▶ Provide opportunities for Pre-K and K teachers to collaborate and learn together around readiness and incorporating play into K, in an effort to make environments more similar.
  - Virtual "live" observations in both settings / Zoom debrief
     Q&A / Shared PD

# ALEX GOE - TCSD PRESCHOOL LIAISON CONTINUED...

- ★ Kinder Ambassador Program ("A Day in the Life") Videos
  - Video a kindergartner's day through their own perspective & share with area preschools
  - Chance for K students to be role models and feel 'big'
  - Opportunity for preschoolers to 'visit' their new school settings & check out the most important areas (classroom, playground, bathrooms, specials etc)
  - o In the future (sans COVID) preschoolers will be invited to visit K classrooms & spend time with their K ambassadors.

### ★ Reimagine the K Round-Up Screener

- Move towards an opportunity to connect with incoming families and welcome them to their new school communities
- Take place in August
- Tour the school
- Spend more time at the school in comfortable settings & less time being formally screened → hopefully get a better picture of each student in more authentic school settings, than the original screener provided.
